What is Apologetics?

- "Apologein" = to tell fully, narrate
- An "apologia" – defense of the faith (defense speech in the courtroom)
- 1 Pet 3:15 – always have a reason for the hope that you have, but give it with courtesy, respect and a clear conscience

A Foundational Conviction

"The desire for God is written in the human heart, because the man [sic] is created by God and for God; and God never ceases to draw man [sic] to himself. Only in God will he find the truth and happiness he never stops searching for."

Why Don't People Believe?

The intimate and vital bond between the human person and God can be "forgotten, overlooked, or even explicitly rejected" (CCC 28)

This may be due to:

- Revolt against evil in the world
- Religious ignorance or indifference
- Cares and riches of the world
- Scandal of bad example on the part of believers
- Currents of thought hostile to religion
- Attitude of sinful person which makes one hide from God out of fear and flee his call

A Method from Blaise Pascal

Men [sic] despise religion. They hate it and are afraid it may be true. The cure for this is first to show that religion is not contrary to reason, but worthy of reverence and respect.

Next make it attractive, make good men [sic] wish it were true, and then show that it is.

Worthy of reverence because it really understands human nature.

Attractive because it promises true good.

Apologetics at the Thresholds: Curiosity

- Not contrary to reason, but worthy of reverence and respect
- Make it attractive, make good [people] wish it were true

Not Contrary to Reason

- It's dumb to believe in God (science has disproved or superseded religion)
- Religion is dangerous – violent
- Anti-woman
- Anti-diversity
- The problem of evil and suffering
- We don't need God to be good
- God doesn't exist

On the Existence of God

- Creation and the origins of the universe – the Creator God and the Big Bang
- Fine-tuned for Life – initial and constant conditions for intelligent life
- Science is predicated upon the intelligibility of the world (which is a function of belief in God as creator)
- Argument from desire: "If I find in my self a desire which no experience in this world can satisfy, the most probable explanation is that I am made for another world" (C.S. Lewis)
- Argument from Beauty
- Argument from Religious Experience

Make it [faith] attractive

- The power of God's love
- What it means to be a son or daughter of God
- That it provides the most coherent response to the problem of suffering
- True Freedom
- Happiness and Joy
- Forgiveness is possible (or the beauty of Jesus' moral teaching)
- The ultimate peace and perfection are possible
- A new heavens and a new earth

Another Approach – N.T. Wright *Simply Christian*

- Quest for Spirituality
- Longing for Justice
- Hunger for Relationships
- Delight in Beauty
- Why do we have these feelings and desires?
- Alternative possibilities ...?
- Christian story as the best account of human experience
