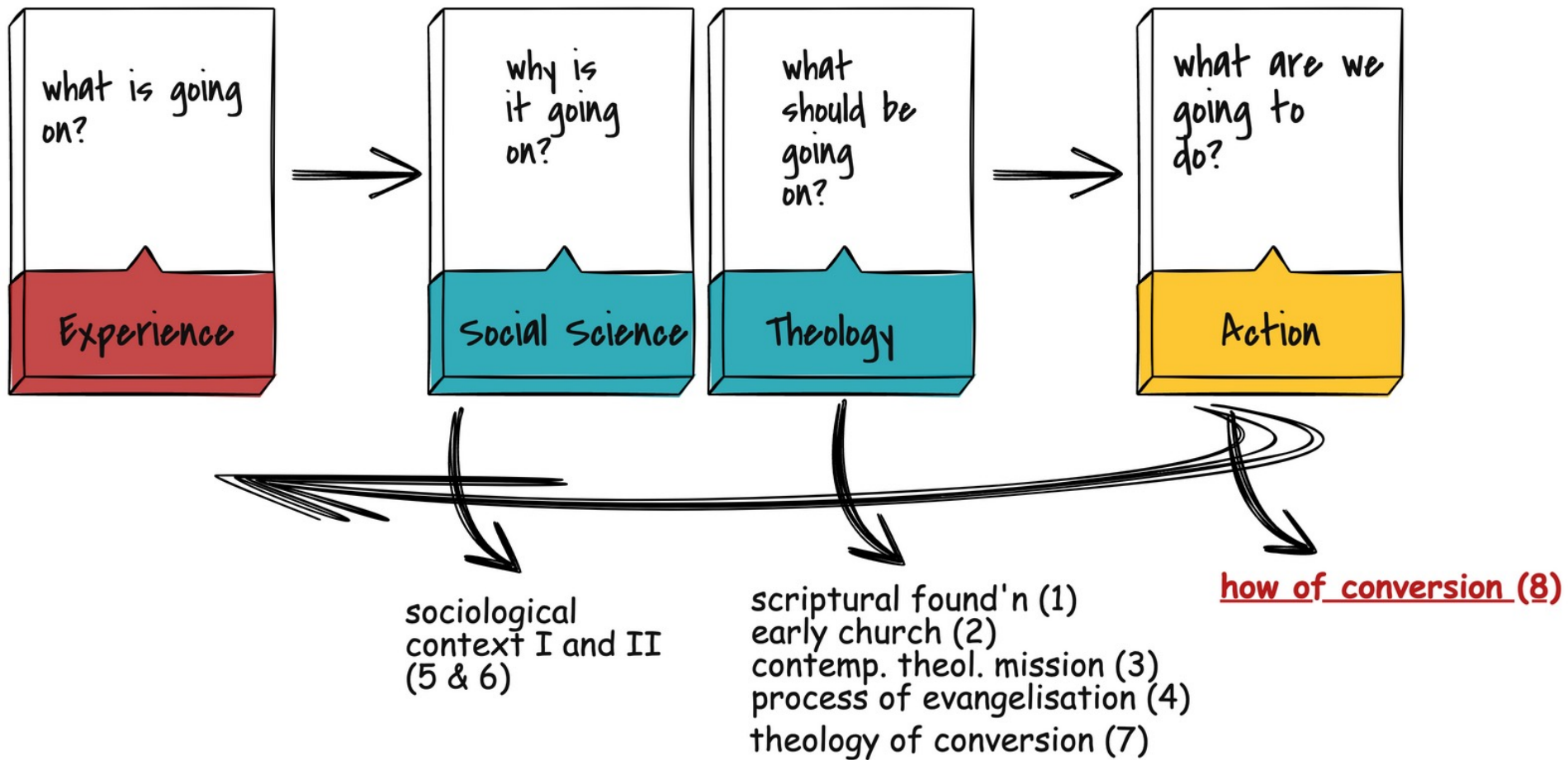

- Sherry Weddell's Thresholds
- Albert Winsemann's Engagement model



# Lewis Rambo's Model

← 1. Context - sociocultural and micro →

6. Commitment: decisive choice - a no and a yes



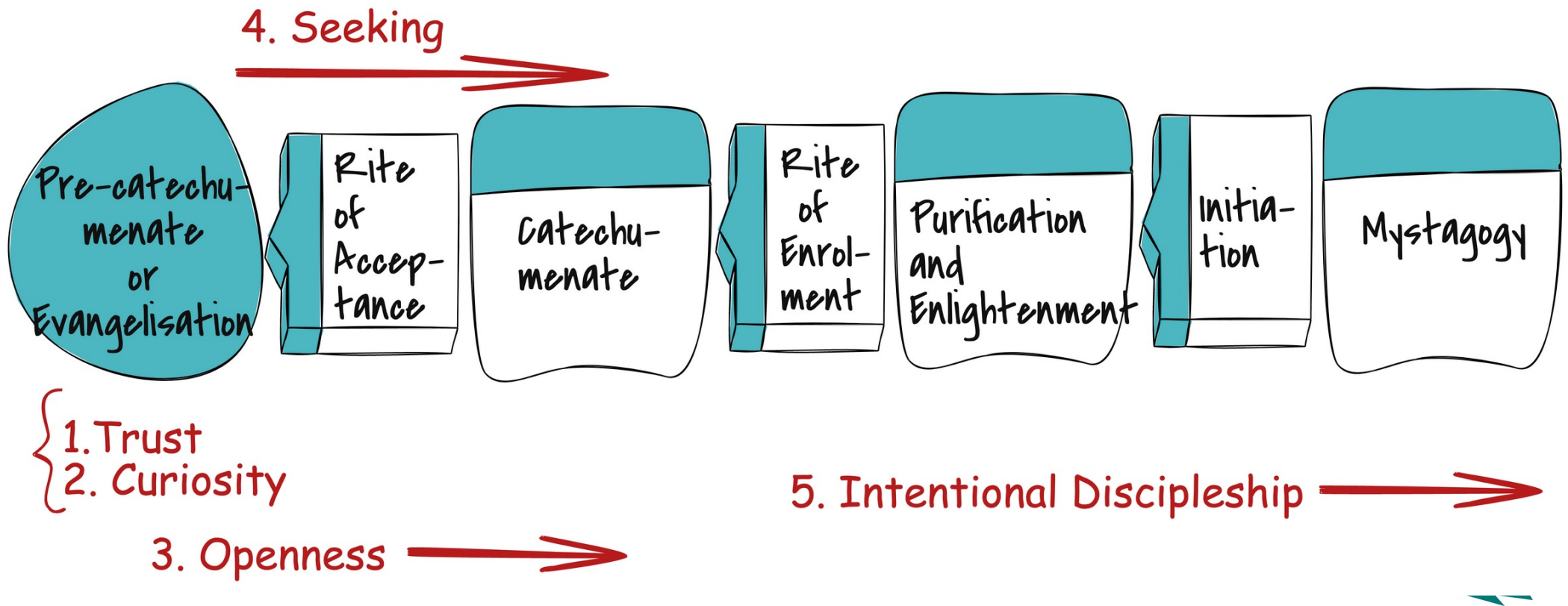
2. Crisis: dissonance  
3. Quest: intentional search  
4. Encounter: with new religious group thru advocates

5. Interaction: relationships, rituals, rhetoric, and roles

7. Consequences: living it out

# Threshold 1: Trust

- Positive association – some aspect of faith, person, experience
- E.g. "Mary" in RCIA



## Threshold 2: Curiosity

- Can begin with curious about aspect of church teaching, practice, or person, or thing > grace
- Curiosity about Jesus > key
- Personal God is issue here too
- Stages –
  - Awareness > I can have a personal relationship with God
  - Engagement > starts looking – friend, reading etc
  - Exchange > intense curiosity, open dialogue



## Threshold 3: Openness

- Open to the possibility of spiritual and personal change
- May feel terrifying to the person undergoing it
- Can be a back and forwards sort of time
- Key things:
  - Connect the dots – God has been at work
  - Ask for a sign
  - Pray for them to be open to God
  - Pray themselves to be open to God



# Threshold 4: Seeking

- Focus upon Jesus and the kerygma
- Active rather than passive
- Seeking – actively seeking Jesus
- Openness to seeking – works of mercy, prayer,
- Sin comes up – relatively late in the journey



# Threshold 5: Intentional Discipleship

- Committed follower of Jesus



# “Threshold Conversations”

- To ascertain what threshold is someone at:
- “Tell me about your relationship with God up until this point”
- “What do you mean by [atheist, agnostic, spiritual]?”
- “Do you believe in God?”
- “Tell me about the God you don’t believe in”
- “Do you ever pray?” “How?”
- “What do you know or believe about Jesus?”
- Be curious

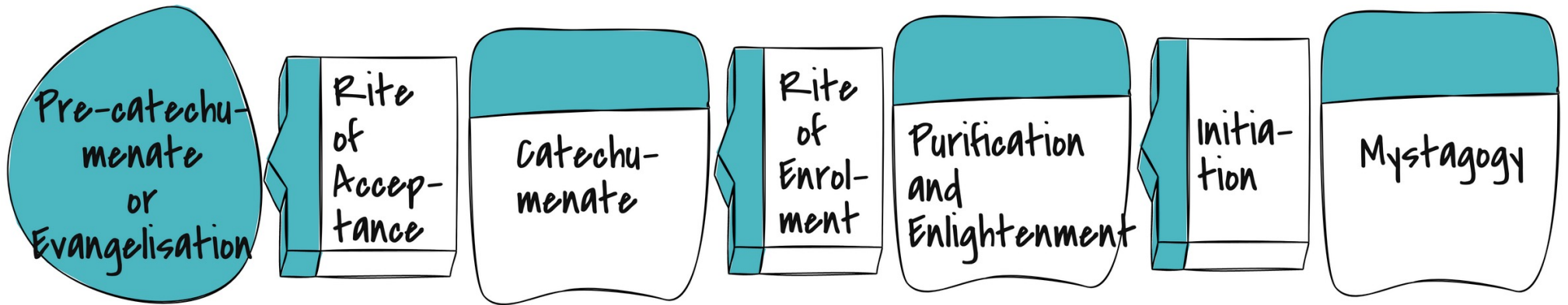


# Albert Winsemann (Gallup)

- *Growing an Engaged Church*
- Perhaps people once – believed, and then behaved and so got to belong
- Now though: belong first, then behave, then believe

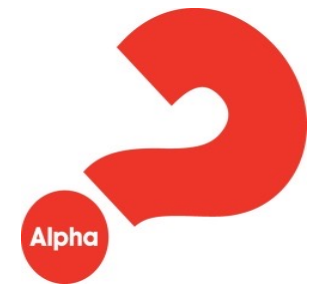

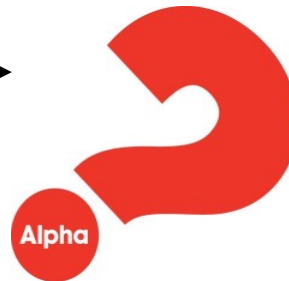

# Alpha as a Changer of Culture

- Evangelising is prioritized – fosters an encounter with Christ and the beginnings of missionary discipleship
- Evangelization is the driver (the “pump” or the “engine room”) for all other ministries
- Small groups create a sense of community
- Evangelised people want to worship God
